### **Prologue**

The Utah Amateur Radio Club was organized under its present name in 1927, although its beginnings may date back as early as 1909. In 1928, it became affiliated with the American Radio Relay League (club #1602) and is a non-profit organization under the laws of Utah. It holds a club station license with the call W7SP, a memorial call for Leonard (Zim) Zimmerman, an amateur radio pioneer in the Salt Lake City Area.

**Meetings**: The club meets each month except July and August. The meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month at 7:30 PM in the University of Utah Engineering and Mines Classroom (EMCB) building, Room 103.

**Membership**: Club membership is open to anyone interested in amateur radio; a current license is not required. Dues are \$17 per year, including a *Microvolt* subscription. *The Microvolt* and membership cannot be separated. Those living at the same address as a member who has paid \$17 may obtain a membership without a *Microvolt* subscription for \$9. ### June Meeting Building Change

We have just learned that due to construction, our regular room in EMCB will not be available for the June meeting. Instead, we will be meeting in a newly completed building just east of EMCB. The official meeting place is Room 2230 of the John and Marva Warnock Engineering Building. This is the building that occupies what used to be our favorite parking lot on the west side of Central Campus Drive. It can be accessed from the same parking lots we have been using to reach EMCB. Here are two options:

**Option 1**: Park in the Merrill Engineering Building (MEB) parking lot near the northeast corner. This is the same lot that most people have been using for recent meetings. Walk along the tsidewalk just east of MEB until you see the new building in front of you. Enter at any convenient entrance. This approach requires going up a few short stairways to get between sidewalk levels.

**Option 2**: Park in the lot that is on the east side of Central Campus Drive just south of MEB and south of Federal Way. (This is the lot that most people used just after construction started.) Cross Central Campus Drive and go in the east entrance of the new Warnock Engineering Building, which should be obvious from this location. There is also a drive-through area in front of the building where people can be dropped off, and a few parking places for the handicapped.

Once in the building... Once you are inside the building, look for the elevators near the east end. Take an elevator to the second floor. Walk straight west on the second floor, crossing a bridge across a large atrium. Our lecture room will be the last room on the right.





## June Meeting: Field Day Thursday, June 7th, 7:30 PM

Field Day, amateur radio's biggest contest, is coming up June 23 and 24, and the June meeting, to be held Thursday, June 7, will be devoted to the club's Field Day entry. We'll be looking at some scenes from previous Field Days and talking about plans for the coming event. There will be explanations for the newcomers, operating tips, and pictures. If you're new to Field Day, this is a great chance to find out what it's all about. If you're already a Field Day regular, it will be a chance to reminisce. And if you regularly avoid Field Day, it will be an opportunity to remember why.

Field Day is an annual nationwide contest to encourage portable and mobile operation and to test and demonstrate our ability to establish communications from almost anywhere in case of an emergency. Stations are set up from locations out in the field and try to work as many other stations as possible in a 24- to 27-hour period. Here are a few details about Field Day itself. Andrew Madsen, AC7CF, has agreed to be chairman of the event this year. We will be going back to the spot just south of Payson Lakes that we have used for a number of years. We will most likely enter in the 3A class (three transmitters operating portable). It is a great opportunity for a family camp-

out. Some folks plan to spend the entire week leading up to Field Day weekend. The site is unimproved, however, so plan on bringing your own food, water, shelter, etc.

Of course, the meeting will include the "standard" meeting features:

- The chance to meet face-to-face the people you talk to on the air.
